During this important time of the year, I would like you to remember that throughout the history of the United States of America many Freemasons were involved in the ideals that helped form this great nation. The history of Freemasonry and the history of this country are very clearly interwoven. The following is a short list of some well known Masonic Presidents:

George Washington, James Monroe, Andrew Jackson, James K. Polk, James Buchanan, Andrew Johnson, James A. Garfield, William McKinley, Theodore Roosevelt, William Howard Taft, Warren G. Harding, Franklin D. Roosevelt, Harry S. Truman, and Gerald Ford.

Of the 56 signers of the Declaration of Independence, the number nine¹ is usually accepted as the absolute minimum of Freemasons who signed the Declaration. Clearly, 13 of the 39 who signed the Constitution were members of Masonic Lodges². Of the others, absolute proof has not been found. The year 1717 is important in England, as local Masonic Lodges created a system whereby they sent representatives to a body called the Grand Lodge, which governed them all. The Grand Lodge then elected its own Grand Master. The experiment, which began in the United States in 1788, is one in which states send their representatives to a Congress. And if Brother Alexander Hamilton had prevailed, the Congress would be electing the President of the United States³. A number of authorities report that General George Washington's staff looked like a Masonic convention. The list of American Masons in Washington's service included many of his Generals. Other revolutionary heroes included Patrick Henry, Nathan Hale, and John Paul Jones, just to name a few⁴.

The implementation of our democratic ideals are continuing while our servicemen and women serve in harm's way in the military preserving those same ideals that our founding fathers sought in the founding of the United States of America.

Freemasons have always played an integral role by ensuring the foundation of a successful and productive nation. Sir Knights if we want this to continue, it is up to each of us. Each of you must do your part in ensuring that we continue to play an integral role in the future.
